Description: This unit seeks to develop an understanding of worldviews, and in particular the Christian worldview and its application in a variety of areas. It examines the nature and functions of a worldview and the history of reflection on worldviews. It examines issues involved in the development of a Christian worldview from Scripture, including the place of Christian scholarship. Students are encouraged to apply a Christian worldview to areas of personal interest.

Method: Class instruction, participation in and presentation of class seminars, reading and assignments.

Assessment: 310: 2000 word essay, 1000 word class paper, project applying a Christian worldview

510: 3000 word essay, 1000 word class paper, project applying a Christian worldview.

PE402/602 Theological Ethics (4 cps)

Conditions: Prerequisite of 16 cps of core foundation level units and two theology units at 400 level or higher, one of which may be, PE325/525 Philosophy of Religion (2 cps) a corequisite.

Description: This unit examines the theological foundations for the task of ethics, assists students to develop a biblical and theological ethical approach and examines a range of current ethical issues.

Method: Class instruction, assigned reading, assignment, participation in and presentation of class seminars.

Assessment: 402: One 1.5 hour exam, one 1000 word summary of a Christian ethical thinker, one 2000 word essay on ethical issue.

602: One 1.5-hour exam, one 2000 word book review, one 2500 word essay on ethical issue.
