GRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE AWARDS (ACT COURSES) IN THEOLOGY

1. GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF DIVINITY (GradDipDiv)

Duration:	One year full-time or equivalent.
Credit points:	32
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate theological award for those with a prior degree in a non-theological discipline. It offers a grounding at an appropriate academic level for those seeking to integrate Biblical and theological study with their professional or academic careers.
Admission:	A non-theological degree. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
Modes:	Full-time, Part-time, occasional Intensives. Some units offered in evenings and it may be possible to complete this award by evening study over several years.
Youth Allowance/ Austudy/Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE HELP:	Available to qualifying students. For more information go to Fees.
Overseas students:	Available to overseas students.
Course structure:	Units are drawn from the 500, 600 and 700 pool of units. The curriculum consists of 12 cps in core foundation level units (8 cps in Old Testament and New Testament and 4 cps in Church history or Theology) plus 20 cps from the 500-600 pool of units. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook, and see below under Master of Divinity for unit offerings. The unit IN650 Integration Project may be taken.

2. MASTER OF DIVINITY (MDiv)

Duration:	Three years full-time or equivalent.
Credit points:	96
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate theological award for those with a prior degree in a non-theological discipline. It provides a solid grounding in Biblical, theological and pastoral studies for those preparing for Christian ministry.
Admission:	Applicants must have a non-theological degree. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
Modes:	Full-time, Part-time (including some evening), occasional intensives.
Youth Allowance / Austudy / Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE HELP:	Available to qualifying students. For more information go to Fees.
Overseas students:	Available to overseas students.
Course structure:	Units are drawn from the 500, 600 and 700 pool of units. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for further details on course structure. units listed below are 4 cps unless stated.

3. GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN THEOLOGY/MINISTRY (GradDipTh/GradDipMin)

Duration:	One year full-time or equivalent.
Credit points:	32
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate coursework diploma designed for those in ministry as in-service education.
Admission:	A primary degree in theology (BTh/BMin or equivalent). Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
Modes:	Full-time (May involve enrolment in units at another college); Part-time; Frequent intensives, some on a regular triennial cycle. See the Schedule of unit offerings at 700 level.
Youth Allowance / Austudy / Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE-HELP:	Available to qualifying students.
Overseas students:	Available to overseas students.
Course structure:	Units are drawn from the 700 level pool. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for further details on course structure. Each unit is normally worth 8 cps. See under Units (Postgraduate) for details of Units offered.

4. MASTER OF ARTS IN THEOLOGY/MINISTRY (MA[Th/Min])

Duration:	Two years full-time or equivalent. Maximum part-time is six years.
Credit points:	64
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate coursework degree designed for those in ministry as in-service education.
Admission:	A primary degree in theology (BTh/BMin or equivalent). Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
Modes:	Full-time (May involve enrolment in units at another college); Part-time; Frequent intensives, some on a regular triennial cycle. See the Schedule of unit offerings at 700 level.
Youth Allowance / Austudy:	Expected to be available from 2012.
Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE HELP:	Available to qualifying students.
Overseas students:	Available
Course structure:	Units are drawn from the 700 level pool. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for further details on course structure. Each unit is worth 8 cps, with the exception of a Research Project which is worth 16 cps. Some units are offered as intensives.

5. MASTER OF THEOLOGY (MTh)

Duration:	Two years full-time or equivalent.
Credit points:	64
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate research degree in theology which might form a suitable qualification to teach in a theological discipline.
Admission:	Minimum of (four year) BTh Hons IIB or MDiv or equivalent. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
Modes:	Full-time Part-time.
Youth Allowance / Austudy:	Expected to be available from 2012.
Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE-HELP:	Available to qualifying students.
Overseas students:	Available to overseas students.
Course structure:	Research only (50000-word thesis) or combination of coursework (two coursework units) and research (35000-word thesis). The PTC offers supervision to a restricted number of students in the areas of Old and New Testaments and Church History. The unit on Research Methods (RM095) is required before commencing thesis. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for further details on course structure

6. DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY (ThD)

Duration:	Minimum two years full-time, normally three and maximum of eight (part-time).
Purpose:	This is a postgraduate research degree in theology designed to equip teachers and research supervisors in theological colleges or other tertiary institutions.

Admission:	Minimum of (four year) BTh Hons I. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook.
Modes:	Full-time, Part-time.
Youth Allowance / Austudy:	Not available.
Abstudy:	Available to qualifying students.
FEE-HELP:	Available to qualifying students.
Overseas students:	Available to overseas students.
Course structure:	Research leading to submission of a 100,000 word thesis. The PTC offers supervision to a restricted number of students in the areas of Old and New Testaments and Church History. The unit on Research Methods (RM095) is required before commencing thesis. Consult the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for further details on course requirements and procedures.

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
